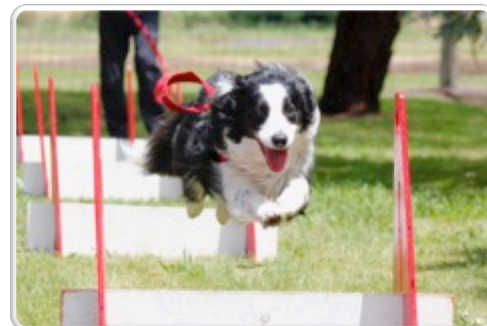
I am looking forward to an exciting year for all our members and their dogs.

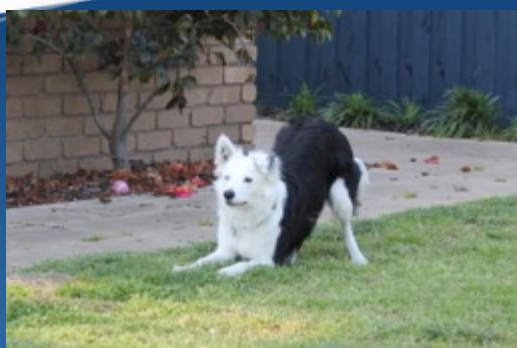

**Name:** Peter Gibson

**Tell us a bit about your dogs:** We currently have four dogs, Red, Blue, Katie and Tam. They are a motley crew who are as varied as the Melbourne weather. Each dog has its very own personality. Red was our first dog as a family and it soon became apparent that we had chosen a rewarding pooch in Red. He appears aloof, is more interested in food, people with food, balls and people with balls than he is with getting involved with other dogs. Tam is our terrier and is the most gregarious of our dogs. This leads him into situations where some dogs see him as an easy target for pestering. When he finds himself in situations where he becomes uncomfortable he is called back and this helps the other dogs reset their sights on their next target. Blue is my daughter's dog. He is a shy dog who does not approach people comfortably. With other dogs he has and still can be reactive depending on the signals others put out. We are still trying to recognise those signals and help him resolve any issues by making choices to return rather than get involved.

**Tell us a bit about yourself:** I've always had dogs and couldn't imagine my life without them. I work full time and study and have always loved being around animals.

**Tell us a bit about your dogs:** I have a 14 month old German Shorthaired Pointer. Her name is Charlotte. She is full of energy and personality. We enjoy training for tracking and obedience at the club.

**What made you decide to get involved in the committee?** I trained my German Shepherds at the dog club many years ago and really enjoy it. I enjoy helping people with their dogs and love being around the dogs so I thought I'd join the committee.

## Patience, Persistence and Pace: The tale of Hurricane Kali

6 years ago we decided the time was right to add to our family. After much researching we came across a beautiful litter of border collie puppies. They were from UK lines and so had markings quite different to the typical borders you see here and I instantly fell in love. When the pups were 4 weeks old we went to meet them, 4 weeks later we picked up our little bundle of fluff and called her Kali. Damn she had spunk! Within a matter of weeks she had chewed through 10 times her weight in our belongings. It was only then that I learned that 'Kali' was the goddess of destruction and eternal energy. It was so fitting, so she was registered "Destruction Goddess" and nicknamed "Hurricane Kali."

At just shy of 6 months old Kali was the unfortunate casualty of a guy with aggressive dogs at the local dog park. Although physically she recovered beautifully, psychologically she was very wary of dogs she didn't know and as time went on she began to show more and more reactivity towards dogs that got in her personal space.

At 12 months we officially started flyball training with her. Since the day she came home we had been laying the foundations of what she would need. As I expected she picked it up in no time. Within a few sessions she could retrieve the ball over the 4 jumps and within a few months she had a lovely tight, quick box turn. None of this was unexpected, but what came next was!

As she progressed we started introducing other dogs (as is the normal progression of training – after all flyball is a team sport, you can't compete alone!) Coming from working bloodlines Kali, started to complete the run and then run circles around the other dogs. To include all the ways we tried to correct this would require a novel, however suffice it to say that we tried everything we could think of. I sought advice from experienced flyball instructors from other clubs as well as from other non-flyball trainers. We even tried attending herding school to try and develop these herding instincts so they came with some control. But nothing seemed to work. As the club got larger, the time I could dedicate to Kali became less and less until flyball training for her was – try to give her a run, watch her run around in circles ignoring my pleas for her to come, (or stop, drop, or listen in anyway), banish her to her crate and have her stay there



for the rest of the session while I worked with everyone else's dogs. I had pretty much given up hope of her ever competing.

I do not exaggerate when I say that this went on for years. It was only with the help of a friend that I started training Kali in my own time. Away from unfamiliar dogs she very slowly began to stop running around and slowly over about 3 years she started to focus. At first just running on her own and then with another dog (one she knew very well) and then against that dog until bit by bit over time she learnt to run with other dogs and against other dogs just like at a competition. Even then I was nervous to enter her. For months my teammates encouraged me to enter her but I still worried that the hype of the competition environment would be too much for. So for 12 months I took her to competitions and into the competition ring where we did a few runs during the warm up time with lots of praise, play and rewards and within no time she was chomping at the bit to have a 'real go'. So surrounded by dogs she knew and trusted I bit the bullet and entered her and wouldn't you know it she ran 18/18 perfect faultless runs and gained her first two titles in her first competition. 6 years it took me to get here and I'm still nervous every time I run her, but Kali is a lesson to us all about patience and persistence and most importantly working at your dog's pace.

I'd be lying if I said it didn't sting a little watching so many people start training and competing in a quarter of the time it took me. But racing her now is also that bit more rewarding because of the work it took to get here.
